7.2.1. Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Tezpur College

Best Practice No-1:

lessons more engaging and interactive. Student participation in class discussions and activities has increased, and there is a noticeable improvement in their enthusiasm for learning.




SCREENSHOT 1: ICT (GOOGLE CLASSROOM) OF BSC 2ND SEMESTER FYUGP 2024




PICTURE 1: ICT (SMART BOARD) USE DURING FYUGP BOTANY CLASSES AT ROOM NO. SC-06






