### **COLLEGE RULES**

- i. As regards maintaining the academic discipline in the College the decision of the College administration shall be final.

- iii. All notices desired to be circulated by the Students anywhere in the College shall require the approval of the Principal.
- iv. The societies and association, shall be subject to such guidance and control as the college administration may prescribe from time to time.
- v. Only such societies and associations as have been recognised by the Principal shall be entitled to avail the facilities of the College premises.
- vi. Principal's signature over the identity card is must and shall be affixed within 15days from the date of admission and bringing the identity card to college is compulsory for all the students.
- vii. Filled up registration forms should be submitted in the office within the stipulated time as fixed by the college office. No registration form will be received after that.
- viii. Wearing of College uniform is compulsory.
  - For Girls-Light Blue Kurta and White Salwar and white Dupatta. Leggings not allowed
  - For Boys-White Shirt and Black Pants.
  - Sweater (for winter): Black Sweater for both Boys and girls. Jeans Pants and jackets not allowed.
- ix. Class attendance of student should not be less than 75%.
- x. Students have to produce identity cards and admission receipt at the time of issuing library cards.
- xi. Students have to produce identity cards and admission receipt at the time of voting for students union election. Students must come in college uniform to cast vote.
- xii. The following activities of the students in the college will be treated as a serious offence. All powers for maintaining discipline are vested with the principal.
  - a. Destruction of college properties like glass, furniture, wall, fencing etc.
  - b. Misbehaviour shown towards fellow friends, teachers and employees of the College.
- xiii. Mobile phone is not allowed inside the class rooms and examination halls.

# **EXAMINATION RULES**

### As per Academic Calendar:

- i. A student failing to appear in any college examination or a part thereof on any ground shall be debarred from appearing the final examination.
- ii. Presence in all periodic assessments is compulsory.

# GIRL'S HOSTEL, TEZPUR COLLEGE: HOSTEL RULES

- 1. The admitted students are to report to the superintendent before boarding for the first time.
- ii. The boarders must maintain a decent, dignified and disciplined hostel life style inside and outside the hostel and a decent dress code.
- iii. They must abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel as may be prescribed to them by the college authority, violation of which will invite strict disciplinary action amounting to expulsion from the college.
- iv. Boarders must enter hostel within the time fixed by the superintendent / warden for summer and winter season and must be present at the time of evening prayer and roll call.
- v. Visitors other than legal/local guardians are not allowed to meet the inmates of the hostel without the permission of the principal.
- vi. Ill treatment to co-boarders, cooks and other employees of the hostel will be considered as an offence.
- viii. The use of electrical equipments such as iron, heater etc. is not permitted.
- 1x. The boarders must attend their classes regularly and must appear in all internal examinations and other academic activities of the departments of the college.

- x. Disturbance of any kind during study hours is treated as serious offence.
- xi. All the boarders must abide by the mess rules prescribed by the mess committee.
- xii. Ragging in any forms is punishable.
- xiii. The boarders must apply to the superintendent in writing and obtain his permission while leaving the hostel.
- xiv. Boarders are allowed to leave the hostel for various purposes only for a day in the week fixed by the superintendent.
- xv. The students leaving for private tution/coaching classes are to maintain a register showing the signature of their respective tutor! teacher.
- xvi. All the boarders must attend the evening prayer.
- xvii. Visiting hours Summer- 3 P.M. 6 p.m.

### Winter-2.30 P.M. - 5.00 P.M.

xviii. Parents must obtain permission from Superintendent, when any boarder wants to go outside the hostel for any purpose from their registered mobile on Hostel Superintendent's mobile.

# CANCELLATION OF SEATS

Students failing to attend class for 15 (fifteen) days at a stretch in the first month of commencement of classes shall forfeit their seats.

Students who fail to attend their classes for a certain period of time at a STRETCH on genuine, resonable and acceptable grounds such as serious diseases or accidents and related treatment involving themselves and members of the family, death of near and dear ones, academic/sports/cultural activities approved by the college etc. must apply in writing to the head of the institution for consideration for the period immediately after such absence. Application must be supported with testimonials/documents wherever necessary. Even for such cases the actual attendance must not be less than 50%.
