Section – I TEZPUR COLLEGE PROFILE

Tezpur College came into being in 1965 due to the efforts of some like-minded people, to cater to the growing demand of a Higher education institution in Tezpur. Under the zeal of some prominent citizens of Tezpur led by Late Dulal Chandra Bhattacharjee, Late P. Prasad and Late Heramba Sarmah, senior advocate of the Tezpur Bar, Tezpur College had its humble beginning in the premises of the Tezpur Academy, where classes were held in the evening. Thereafter, the college was shifted to its present location near Central Jail in 1968. Late Dulal Chandra Bhattacharjee was the founder President of the College, Governing Body in 1965.

Late Chandra Mohan Medhi, the Principal of the College who served the college from 1967-1999 established the College as a pioneer academic institution and was instrumental in giving the College a Prominent status. He served the College for long 27 years till his retirement on 31/03/1994. It is because of his selfless dedication that Tezpur College stands tall among the institutions of higher learning in the state.

Mrs Achala Borah took over as Principal i/c from 1/04/1994 and worked in the same capacity till her retirement an 28/02/1998. She was succeeded by Shri Sailaja Kr. Padmapati as Principal i/c on 1/03/1998 till 10/09/1998 when Late Shri Jogendra Nath Choudhury took over as the permanent Principal on 11/04/1998 till his retirement on 31/08/2004. It was during his tenure that the college was assessed and accredited by NAAC, for the first time. After his retirement Mrs. Jeuti Choudhury took over as Principal i/c on 1/09/2004 till the appointment of Dr. Charu Saharia Nath as a regular principal of the college on 09/09/2004. The College was re-accredited in 2011 during her tenure. After her retirement, in January 2016, Shri Kamal Chandra Upadhyaya took over as principal i/c on 31/01/2016. He continued in this capacity till the appointment of Dr. Jyoti Kamal Hazarika as Permanent Principal on 11/08/2016. Soon after assuming the office of the Principal, he initiated a few measures with a view to make the college student-friendly, steps have been taken to revamp the college library, ICT facilities have been provided to the departments and various steps have been taken to enhance the aesthetics of the college.

The College celebrated the Golden Jubilee of the College from the 5th August to the 7th August, 2015 in a befitting manner. The highlight of the celebrations was the publication of as many as 22 books by the various departments and individual teachers.

The College presently provides Undergraduate (UG) and Higher Secondary Courses (HS) in Arts and Commerce stream. BBA Course under Gauhati University is also offered as a Self Financing and Travel and Tourism Management as a Vocational Course. The College has a Study centre of IDOL, Gauhati University and a study centre of KKHSOU. The College also has a fully equipped Gymnasium and an Indoor Stadium and Auditorium. Recently the College has signed two MOUs with Gyalpozhing College of Information Technology, Bhutan and Balipara Foundation, Assam.

COURSE STRUCTURE (B B A)

As per the approved regulations of Gauhati University, a candidate who possesses a 10 + 2 degree in Arts, Science, Commerce or a Diploma in Engineering with minimum 40 % marks in aggregate from a recognized Board will be eligible for admission into the First Semester B B A Programme.


- 1. Admission will be strictly as Merit basis.
- 2. The merit list will be available in the college website.
- 3. Selected candidates should take their admissions on specified date.
- 4. A valid phone number of the candidate to be given.
- 5. All communication will be done through phone number.
- 6. A valid e-mail ID to be given.
- 7. Scanned copy of the candidate's signature, passport size photograph, pass certificate, Registration certificate, caste certificate, break of study certificate, differently abled certificate, scanned copy of candidate's bank passbook front page (must be distinct), migration certificate.
- [Candidate must submit all the documents whichever are required] to be sumbitted.
- 8. Details of bank account of the candidate.
- a) Name of the Bank account holder.
- b) Bank account number.
- c) IFSC number.
- d) Name of the bank branch.
- 9. Student must furnish one of the following supporting documents to prove their domicile of Assam PRC / Voter ID of self or parent / NRC of self or parents / ADHAR card of self or parents / BPL card / birth certificate issued by Registrar of Birth and Death / passport of self or parent.
- 10. The self financing courses and streams will not be included under Fee Waiver Scheme.
- 11. Once the bank details are submitted by the students, the same cannot be changed during their tenure in the college otherwise they will be deprived from the govt. beneficiary schemes. The student has to submit necessary undertaking in this regard.
- 12. Annual income of father, mother and guardian and their contact numbers (income certificate not required)

PROCESS OF APPLICATION

- 1. Students need to visit the College website www.tezpuronline.co.in and register themselves for admission by clicking "Apply Online tab" in the home page of the website.
- 2. After Registration click apply online and follow the following steps:
- i. Login with enrolled phone number and Password (Given by the candidate at the Registration time)
- ii. Fill all the Columns of admission forms and follow the option "Save and Next".
- iii. Candidates can edit all data before clicking "Final submit" option. After Final submission candidates cannot edit any data.
- iv. Student's can upload all required certificates and other relevant documents in proper way.

PROCESS FOR ADMISSION

- 1. To check the Merit list, go through the message received on their registered mobile number for selection.
- 2. After receiving the message the selected students can login to the online portal by using the USER Id and password set by the student.
- After login the students will give the declaration about his/her admission and will proceed.



GENERAL RULES

- ♦ Students must abide by all the rules and regulations of the college. Students violating the rules and regulations are liable for disciplinary action like suspension and even expulsion from the college.

 has to apply at least two days ahead.
- Use of Mobile Phones, Smoking and Consumption of tobacco, alcohol, gutkha or any other intoxicants, inside the college premises is considered a punishable offence.
- Entering the college premises without uniform is strictly prohibited.
- Students must maintain cleanliness of the college campus.

- National and State Merit scholarships can be availed of by the meritorious students of the college as per the Government norms.
- Scholarship for SC and ST students also can be availed of by the students of the respective communities as per norms of the Government.
- Kedermal Charitable Trust scholarship is awarded to 5 meritorious students of Arts and Commerce each in the first semester as per specified norms.
- Book Bank facility is provided to the economically backward students of the college as per specified norms through college library.



STUDENTS' TRAVELLING CONCESSION

• Bonfied student can avail of travel concession through railway and govt. transport by producing valid documents.

HEALTH CHECK UP FACILITY

• The college arranges free health check-up for students by a competent Medical Officer from time to time.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CELL

• Students are provided trainings on Personality development and guidance for career opportunities through seminars, symposium and counseling through professional Carrier Counselor.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

• The Grievance Redressal cell has been set up with the objective of addressing the grievance and problems of the students in a fair manner.

NSS UNIT

• The NSS unit of the college organizes a number of extension activities and community development drives in the different regions of the state including cleanliness drives, awareness programme, adult education programme, afforestation, distribution of aids, provision for drinking water in rural areas. It instils in students values of social responsibilities and students in fair manner.

SPORTS, HEALTH & FITNESS

• To cater to the needs of those with a concern for health and fitness, the college provides a fully equipped unisex gym along with the guidance of a trained instructor. Training for sports such as body-building, wrestling, weight lifting etc. is provided here. For those interested in other indoor sports the college has provided an indoor stadium as well within the college premises.

NCC (GIRLS & BOYS)

• The NCC girls' wing is an active wing of the college having brought laurels to the college many a times in the recent years. Of late, the NCC Boys wings has been newly formed.



• The Chandra Mohan Medhi Library is a modern, well-equipped computerized digital library connected through wifi and SOUL Software. The library prides itself on a large collection of more than 39 thousand books, manuscripts and journals, besides being a member of N–List, facilitating access to e-books and e-journals across the globe. The library has initiated Insitutitonal Repository for E-Resources which users can access through Cloud. Moreover the various departments also have departmental libraries with a good numbers of books.

READING ROOM

• Fully air-conditioned separate readings rooms with all modern facilities are available in the library for both students and teachers. The sitting capacity in the Reading Room is 130 students at a time.

COMPUTER EDUCATION CENTRE

• Free computer education (Basic) is provided to all students.

COLLEGE CANTEEN

•The college canteen is run in a newly constructed spacious building with separate dining room for students as well as teachers and office staff at a subsidised rate.

LANGUAGE LABORATORY

• A Digital Language Laboratory is set up in the college to enhance the language speaking skills of the students with the financial support of the UGC.

GIS LABORATORY

• The Department of Geography is facilitated with a well equipped GIS laboratory. ErDAS IMAGINE 13 and Super Map Deskpro version soft ware are available in the laboratory along with a number of Aerial Photographs, Scanner, Satellite Imagery, GPS and Plotter. The department also have smart class room facilities.

CULTURAL MUSEUM

• The cultural Museum of the college has some unique collection of sculptures, idols, handicrafts, coins and cultural items collected from different places of the region.

CONFERENCE HALL & AUDITORIUM

The college has a well equipped Conference Hall with all modern facilities and a seating capacity of 300 people. The college also has an auditorium cum indoor stadium within the campus.

GIRLS' HOSTEL

The girls' hostel of the college is situated within the campus. At present the girls' hostel can accommodate 58 students. Modern amenities like 24 hours running water, TV, indoor and outdoor games facilities, news paper, internet etc. Admission into the hostel is strictly on merit basis, seats for reserved categories are allotted as per Govt. norms.

- 1. The boarders must maintain a decent, dignified and disciplined hostel lifestyle inside and outside the hostel. They must also maintain a decent dress code.
- 2. They must abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel as may be prescribed to them by the College authority, violation of which will strict disciplinary action amounting to expulsion of the guilty inmate from the hostel, leading also if required attract to consequent expulsion from the college.
- 3. Boarders must enter the hostel within the time fixed by the superintendent / warden for summer and winter seasons and must be present in their respective seats at the time of Roll-Call.
- 4. Entertainment of guests and visitors is not allowed except with prior permission of the authority.
- 5. Visitors other than Legal/Local guardians are not allowed to meet the inmates of the hostel without the permission of the Principal.
- 6. Boarders must have to pay their Mess-Dues as may be fixed from month to month by the mess committee within the 10th day of every month.
- 7. III-treatment of co-boerders, cooks and other employees of the hostel is strictly prohibited.
- 8. The use of electrical equipment such as iron, heater etc. is not permitted.
- 9. The boarders must attend their classes regularly and must appear in all internal examinations and other academic activities of the college.
- 10. All the boarders must abide by the Mess-rules prescribed by the Mess-Committee.
- 11. Ragging is strictly prohibited.

DIGITAL CLASSROOM

The college has few designated digital classrooms equipped with LCD projectors and other hardware to be available to the various departments of the college.

CCTV

The college campus, Library and the buildings are under constant CCTV surveillance.

OTHER FACILITIES

To honour the RTI (Right to Information) Act 2005, the college has constituted an information cell. The College also has an e-content developing and recording room.

COLLEGE BULLETIN

The annual College bulletin 'Heritage' records the academic and co-curricular activities of the different departments as well as endeavors and achievements of the studients, teachers and the employees during the current academic year

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CENTRE

The Equal Opportunity Centre of Tezpur College is created by a mandate of the UGC specifying the need of a functionary within the college set up to ensure equal opportunity for all within its fold.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE AND WALL MAGAZINE
